* Ohio Revised Code section 5747.24(A)(1) states that an individual "has one contact period in this state" if the individual is away overnight from his/her abode located outside this state and, while away overnight from that abode, spends at least some portion, however minimal, of each of two consecutive days in this state. Further, Ohio Revised Code section 5747.24(A)(2) provides that up to 30 periods that would otherwise constitute contact periods under division (A)(1)(a) of this section shall not be considered contact periods during a taxable year if the individual spends any portion of either day of each such contact period for conditions outlined in Ohio Revised Code sections 5747.24(A)(2)(a).

Federal Privacy Act Notice
